Charlie House

P2-P7 took part in an assembly to find out all about Charlie House. Charlie House is a charity which supports children in the north-east of Scotland who have a life-limiting or lifethreatening disability.

The children took part in workshops last week to try to place themselves in the shoes of those who perhaps need to use a wheel chair, cannot see, can't use all their limbs, who have severe disabilities; the children enjoyed learning in a practical way and their feedback was very good. At some point we will also have a visit from the Charlie House mascot, Charlie Dog. Later this year we will do fundraisers in support of Charlie House to help build a building to support these very needy children; more information will come from our pupils in the near future.

Wider Achievement

Each week in assembly Ready, Kind and Safe certificates are given to children who teachers and staff believe deserve extra house point tokens and a certificate. These all count towards who wins the House trophy at the end of the summer term.

We have decided to further enhance this system by adding in "Star of the Month" and a 'Semi-Star' ie a close runner up. This will be based on 'wider achievement' - things children do either outside the classroom or in their own time eg scouts, swimming, football, karate etc or giving of their time to help others consistently over time (a community endeavour). The winner will take home a trophy for a month and both Star of the Month and the Semi-Star will gain additional tokens for their house. This way we can celebrate what happens in and out of school.
